Compliance

Areas of Concern:

- Meaningful use
 - Some measures that were optional in stage 1 of meaningful use requirements are mandatory in stage 2
 - Physician penalties in 2014
- Fraud
 - Obama admin: EHR fraud won't be tolerated
 - Upcoding
 - Cloned notes
